PRESIDENT: Thank you. Perhaps if I start by taking any appearance or some appearance.

**MR P. TULLGREN:** President, I am happy to give you some appearance although I'm not sure how much my appearance helps. My name is TULLGREN and I seek to appear on behalf of the Australian Liquor, Hospitality and Miscellaneous Workers Union, and I do so on the basis that we have an interest in this award as we are a party and under the provisions of section 43 we are notified, as are all parties, of any applications that are made and we have been notified of this application.

I might indicate now just for the purposes of the record that if the matter were to proceed, we would be arguing that the Hotels Award does not have application. That's in short compass our position, so we would be contesting the application if it is dealt with.

PRESIDENT: Right. Okay. It would appear that there is no representative from the applicant so I am at a bit of a loss as to know what they wish to do with it. It may be that we will try and make some independent inquiries as to whether they wish to proceed with it or not. It's been sitting here for some months now and we were advised that the applicant was in Queensland until 3 August, presumably the year 2000. That has been and gone by my calculation. I think that may be the best way to go; to track him down and find out what he wants to do with it and to alert him to the fact that the union will be intervening as an interested party if the application proceeds.

All right, on that basis I will undertake to contact the applicant to see whether he or she wishes to proceed with the application, advise them that the Liquor Trades Union will seek to intervene as an interested party and we might have some further information in due course.

That matter is stood over to a date and a time to be fixed.
