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AMEND THE **WHOLESALE TRADES AWARD** IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

By deleting Clause 17 - Meal Hours and Tea Money and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"17. MEAL HOURS AND TEA MONEY

- (a) Not less than 30 minutes nor more than one hour shall be allowed for each meal. The employer shall notify the employee in advance of the time fixed for the meal and the time once fixed shall not be altered unless and until one week's notice of such alteration shall have been given by the employer to the employee concerned.
- (b) The interval for an evening meal shall, unless otherwise agreed, immediately succeed the usual weekday finishing time.
- (c) All work done during the meal interval and continuously thereafter until time for a meal is allowed shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (d) Employees required to work overtime for more than 2 hours after the usual weekday finishing time or after 7.30 pm. (whichever occurs first) shall be paid a meal allowance of \$9.45 unless they have been notified the day before of the intention to work overtime beyond the said finishing time. Employees who are so notified but who are not required to work such overtime shall be paid the meal allowance of \$9.45."

OPERATIVE DATE:

This Order shall come into operation from the first full pay period to commence on or after 15 February 1997.
