DECISION

[1] On 21 December 2012, an application was lodged by the Minister administering the State Service Act 2000, (MASSA), pursuant to s.23 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1984*, to vary the Miscellaneous Workers (Public Sector) Award.

[2] At the hearing in Hobart on 18 December 2012, Mr P Baker appeared for MASSA with Ms S Haas. Mr P Tullgren appeared for United Voice, Tasmanian Branch

[3] Mr Baker explained that the purpose of the application was to modernise the award.

[4] It was agreed that with the exception of the Title Clause (1) Clauses 2-9 would remain unchanged at this time, pending imminent discussion, while the remaining clauses would be changed to reflect the contemporary model clauses in the Tasmanian State Service Award.

[5] Both the parties consented to the application.

[6] I am satisfied that the application is consistent with the public interest requirements of the Act.

[7] The order reflecting this interim decision, operative from 18 December 2012, was issued on 20 December 2012. The file is to remain open to allow further variations.
