SECURITY AND WATCHING SERVICES AWARD

Established in respect of the Industry of Security and Watching Services.

DATE OF OPERATION

This award shall come into operation as from the first pay period to commence on or after 4 November 1985.

Provided that, it is a term of this award that the unions undertake that they will not pursue any extra claims, award or overaward, except where consistent with the Principles of Wage Fixation of the Tasmanian Industrial Commission.

This Award incorporates and supersedes the Award of the Tasmanian Industrial Commission dated 23 July 1985 (Part I - Wage Rates No. 1 of 1985)

PART I - WAGE RATES

1. WAGE RATES

Employees of a classification hereunder mentioned shall be paid the amount assigned opposite that classification.

	Per Week \$
1. Control room operator	268.70
2. Watchman/guard/gatekeeper/escort (as defined)	257.50
3. Mobile patrolman	266.20

Leading Hands

Where an employee is appointed a leading hand he shall be paid the following rates extra per week:-

	Per Week \$
If in charge of not less than 3 and not more than 10 employees	13.00
If in charge of more than 10 employees	19.30
