AMEND THE **HOTELS, RESORTS, HOSPITALITY AND MOTELS AWARD** IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

1. By deleting Clause 23 - Meal Money, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"23. MEAL MONEY

An employee required to work overtime for more than two hours without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he or she will be so required to work shall either be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid \$9.45 meal money.

If an employee pursuant to notice has provided a meal and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less than the amount advised, he or she shall be paid as above prescribed for the meal which he or she has provided but which is surplus.

The rates of meal money as above prescribed shall be increased by one cent for every 50 cents per week alteration at the rate of classification - Persons Not Otherwise Provided For, subclause 2, Division A, Clause 8 - Wage Rates hereof."

2. By deleting Clause 60 - Meal Money, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"60. MEAL MONEY

A weekly or part-time employee required to work overtime for more than two hours without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he or she will be so required to work shall either be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid \$9.45 meal money.

If an employee pursuant to notice has provided a meal and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less than the amount advised, he or she shall be paid as above prescribed for the meal which he or she has provided but which is surplus."
